

To ad block or not to ad block?

Ad blockers can drastically reduce the number of annoying and malicious ads that you see while online. This typically leads to a more enjoyable web browsing experience and can even help keep you and your computer safer online. Ad blockers can also improve the load times on webpages that have an excessive number of ads, since the ads are not actually being loaded.

While the benefits of using ad blockers can be very appealing, there are also some downsides. Ad blockers are not perfect and may not block all ads on a website. Ad blockers can even block legitimate content or services by mistake. Some websites, especially news outlets, have started blocking users of ad blockers from accessing their websites. The user may be asked to either pay for a subscription to the website or disable the ad blocker completely before they are allowed access. Website owners do this to try and recover or prevent lost revenue from the ads that are normally displayed on their website. Some ad blockers have lists of non-malicious ads and websites that are allowed past the ad blocker in an effort to appease both the user and website owner.
